COMMITTEE ROLE DESCRIPTION

OUR GOAL

- 3. Contact friends and classmates to emphasize Reunion's message of *Come Back, Give Back*.

WHAT DO YOU DO?

- Communicate to classmates through peer-to-peer outreach, encouraging them to *Come Back* for Reunion Weekend and *Give Back* to Northwestern.
- Use personal networks and social media to generate camaraderie and excitement about Reunion Weekend.
- Actively participate in three committee conference calls and two program update conference calls.
- Provide input on class-specific reunion details to create an exciting and memorable experience.
- Dedicate at least two hours each month in pursuit of these efforts.

WHY IS THIS ROLE IMPORTANT?

- The top two reasons alumni come back for reunion are to reconnect with each other and see campus.
- Personal outreach to friends and classmates is the most effective way to generate interest.
- Your (and your fellow committee members') endorsement of the events and class gift sends a powerful message.
- The sooner classmates commit to participate, the more likely we are to succeed in hitting our goals.
- Having thoughtful leaders and an engaged, cohesive committee takes reunion from good to great.

THE REUNION TEAM'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide goals, tools, and support to ensure the committee's success, including timelines and talking points for committee calls and outreach.
- Share information by website, social media, mail, and email to keep committees and classmates informed about Reunion Weekend programming and initiatives.
- Secure an on-campus venue for the class party and schedule a committee walk-through and menu tasting. Provide a modest discretionary budget, which may be used toward class party enhancements.
- Create a comprehensive Reunion Weekend for the Northwestern community.
- Recommend additional opportunities to engage as a volunteer and donor beyond Reunion Weekend.
